Hooker Distinguished Visiting Professor **Paul Thompson**

University of Strathclyde, Glasgow

Paul is a preeminent theorist of changes in work and organization. His book *The Nature of Work* (Macmillan 1983, 1989) played a major role in the development of labour process theory. Paul is best known for *Organization Misbehaviour* (Sage 1999), 'All Quiet on the Workplace Front: A Critique of Recent Trends in British Industrial Sociology' (Sociology's 6th most cited paper), *Work Organizations* (Palgrave, with David McHugh), and as editor of *Research Notes, Debates and Controversies in Work, Employment and Society*.
